Behind the Scenes: We've looked into YouTube creation, at what goes into documentary making, and other social media. We are also working on making a member's view documentary about our Club!





### 3RD ANNUAL BOEHNER GOLF CLASSIC & FOUNDERS RAFFLE

On June 10, twenty-seven foursomes, volunteers, staff and Boys & Girls Club youth gathered at Wetherington Golf & Country Club to kick off our 4th Annual Boehner Classic to benefit the Boys & Girls Club Building, Endowment and Emergency Fund!

Thanks to the generosity of our BGCWCL Board, our attendees and this community, we broke last year's record, and raised a **NET INCOME** of \$129,385 for the Golf Classic; and the Founder's Raffle raised a **Net** of \$13,400, for a combined total of \$142,785, nearly \$22,000 more than in 2018.

Every kid deserves a great future. The Boys & Girls Club of West Chester/Liberty depends on financial contributions from our community in order to provide enriching programming and safe havens for the young people in the West Chester/Liberty Township area. However, if more households in the community would be willing to step up with a small monthly donation to support the Club, we could reach our goal quite readily. If 3,000 households in our community gave just \$20/month, that would provide \$720,000/year to the Club. That would make our \$950,000 goal well within our reach.

Monthly giving of \$20 or more per month is the best way to sustain our operations and programming. Many non-profits such as St. Jude, military/veteran funds, and pet charities fund their operations through monthly donation programs. Please consider supporting the Club and our members through a monthly donation. Your investment can change a child's future. We thank you, and our Club members thank you as well!
